Test(s): Training: ADS Test 4; Preliminary: ADS Test 2; Intermediate: ADS Test 1; FEI: FEI Horse/Pony Single FEI #9, FEI Horse Pair (FEI #8B), FEI Horse Four-in-hand (FEI #8A), FEI Pony Pair and Four-in-hand FEI #10.  
 Ring/Warm-up area Footing: Compacted sand  
 Other Dressage Info: Presentation at the halt for Training and Preliminary. All tests judged by entire jury.

### Marathon

Terrain: Rolling hills, woods, open fields, gravel roads, race track, water crossing  
 Level: Training; 3 Sections; max. 12 km; max. 5 Obstacles,max. 3 gates; water obstacle  
 Level: Preliminary; 3 Sections; max. 16 km; max. 6 Obstacles,max.5 gates  
 Level: Intermediate: 3 Sections; max.16 km; max. 6 Obstacles, max. 5 gates  
 Level: FEI; 3 Sections; max 20 km; max. 7 Obstacles, max.6 gates  
 Other: VSE welcome, entries use same course/obstacles

### Cones

Ring/Warm-up area Footing: Grass / Grass  
 Clearance and speeds per current ADS and FEI rules.  
 Other: May offer Two-Section Competition or Drive-off; may have water splash.

### Other Information

Veterinary/Health Requirements: Negative Coggins test July 1, 2008 or later, valid influenza vaccination certificate.

Stabling Information: Permanent stalls with doors; may have additional temporary stabling under tent

Driver/Groom twice around allowed on marathon? (Article 910): Yes

Entry Requirements: Driver or grooms may compete with a second entry at the discretion of the organizer, scheduling permitted. The second entry must be in a different division or entered as H/C and driven after the competing entry. Grooms may ride with more than one entry in Competitions A and C.

Misc. Show info: Print or Typewrite your entry forms. American entries must have a current ADS membership attached. Canadian entries for Training and Preliminary must have Bronze Sport License; Intermediate must have a Silver Sport License and national passport for horse(s); all FEI class entries must have FEI driver registration; FEI horse passports and license. Canadian entries for FEI classes require a Platinum Sport License. American entries for FEI classes require permission from USEF to compete.

Drug, medication and Cruelty rules of EC and FEI will be observed. All horses must be in stabling with stall doors provided. Organizer has right to consolidate or cancel classes with less than 3 entries; SMV signs required; ATV/ moped type vehicles require safety helmets; all persons on vehicles in marathon must wear protective headgear; vehicle reflectors waived for vehicles in Competitions A and C (EC Article 915.2.1).

Awards Offered: Ribbons to 6th place; prize money for FEI classes; Best overall trophies

At Bromont (on #10) take exit 78 (Bl.Bromont) for 2 km; turn right on Shefford Street for 1 km; then left on Chemoin de Gaspé for 3 km; the event is on the right.
