Marathon

Terrain: Rolling hills, woods, open fields, gravel road and water crossing

Level: Training; A D E Sections; max.12 km; 5 Obstacles

Level: Preliminary; A D E Sections; max.14 km; 6 Obstacles

Level: Intermediate; A,D,E Sections; max. 15 km; 6-7 Obstacles

Level: Advanced; A D E Sections; max.18 km; 6-8 Obstacles

Other: VSE welcome, entries use same course/obstacles

Cones

Ring/Warm-up area footing: compacted sand

Level: Training; Clearance: 40 cm single & pairs; 50 cm teams

Level: Preliminary; Clearance: 35 cm singles & pairs; 45 cm teams

Level: Intermediate; Clearance:30 cm singles & pairs; 40 cm teams

Level: Advanced Cone Settings: 160 cm single horse/ponies & pair ponies; 170 cm pair horse & four-in-hand ponies; 190 cm four-in-hand horses.

Other: may offer two-section competition or Drive-off, may have water splash

Other Information

Veterinary/Health Requirements: Negative Coggins test July 1st, 2009 or later. Valid influenza vaccination certificate.

Stabling Information: perm stable with 80 stalls of 10'x10' (first come registrations), plus additional temporary stabling under tent.
Driver/Groom twice around allowed on marathon? (Article 917) Yes, Driver or grooms may compete with a second entry at the discretion of the organizer, scheduling permitted. The second entry must be in a different division or entered as H/C and driven after the competing entry. Grooms may ride with more than one entry in competition A and C .

Misc. Show info: Print or typewrite your entry forms. American entries must have an ADS membership attached. Canadian entries for Training and Preliminary must have bronze sport license, Intermediate must have a silver sport license and national passport for horse(s). All FEI class entries must have FEI driver registration. FEI passports and license. Canadian entries for FEI classes require a Platinum Sport license. American entries for FEI classes require permission from USEF to compete. Drug, medication and cruelty rules of EC and FEI will be observed. All horses must be in stabling with stall doors provided. Organizer has right to consolidate or cancel classes with less than three entries. SMV signs required. ATV /moped type vehicles require safety helmets, all persons on vehicles in marathon must wear protective headgear, vehicle reflectors waived for vehicles in competitions A and C (EC articles 915.2.1). Your car doors or truck doors must be locked at all times, at your hotel and on the competition site. Thursday, June 24th at 6 pm Wine and cheese offer by Bromont City, Friday, June 25th at 16h Visit to the impressive carriage collection of Mr. Bienvenue.

Awards offered: Ribbons to 6th place, prize money for FEI classes.

From Montreal and Sherbrooke (50 minutes): Highway 10, exit 78, directions to Bromont.

From Quebec City (2 hours 45 minutes): Highway 20, exit 141, Route 137 via Granby. Follow directions for Highway 10 toward Sherbrooke. Exit 78, directions to Bromont.

From Highway 87: Highway 87 N to Canada, Stay on the 15 N, Take exit 42 to merge onto QC-30 E/Route 30 E, Take exit 109 for QC-10 toward Sherbrooke, Exit 78, directions to Bromont.

From Highway 91: Highway 91 N to Canada, Continue on Route 55 N, Take exit 34-O for QC-10 OB toward Montréal, Merge onto Route 10 E, Exit 78, directions to Bromont.

In Bromont: Boulevard Bromont for 2 km, turn right on Shefford street for 1 km, then left on Chemin de Gaspé for 3 km. the event is on the right.
