**Entry/Class Fees:** \$125; **Post Entry Fees:** \$175; **Entry Fee Refund Policy:** all fees before closing July 8th; Full refund before closing date. After closing date, entry fee refunded with vet certificate less \$25 office fee. After closing date, no refund on stalls or dinner tickets. Refunds are processed one week after show completion; **Stall Fee:** \$140 per horse; Tack stalls may be available for an additional \$ 75 each All fees (entry, stall, camping) are for the weekend, including Fri. and Sat. nights only, early arrival or late departure will be additional stall fee of \$75 per night (no charge for out-of-state entrants) 2 bags of shavings provided per stall; water is from Water Buffalos on site near stalls; **Separate Check?** Not necessary; **Stall Refund Policy:** non-refundable; **Other Fees:** Refundable \$25 site fee per horse, fully refundable following checkout inspection of manure, straw and shaving removal, on-site manure receptacle will be available; Electric camp site at Howe Meadow \$50, no horses at the electric sites – fee is inclusive of Friday and Saturday additional nights at \$50 each for Thursday or Sunday; No running water. There may be some high-line sites with primitive camping (request and assigned based on availability) \$50 inclusive of Friday and Saturday nights. Bike Rental available On-Site -- No golf carts or other motorized vehicles allowed: We will have one 6 passenger cart for use by organizers and for course inspections on Fri. and Sat. afternoon and all hazards and courses are readily accessible from standard roadways and/or an easy walk. July 22nd; **Secretary's Office Opens:** 4:00 pm Fri.; **Vet Check:** On move during dressage on Sat; **Course Walk and Briefings:** Fri. 6:00 pm; multiple trips over the course will be made in organizers 6 passenger golf cart only, Horse Drawn wagon tour of the course and Bike rentals are available, also. **Presentation:** On the move Sat; **Mandatory Safety Check:** Prior to Dressage and Marathon Dressage: Sat 9:00 am; **Marathon:** Sun 9:00 am; **Cones:** Sat following Dressage; Cones competition runs concurrent with the Dressage competition, competitors will proceed to Cones as soon as possible following their Dressage completion; **Social Events:** Fri. evening wine & cheese party Sat evening dinner and carriage tour Parade: Parade through Hale Village Sun. at 1 pm -- this is a formal dressage parade with some vintage carriages coming for the parade only; Public Demonstrations: Carriages in the Park Parade, Obstacle driving narration.

### Dressage

**Test(s):** Training: Test 4; Preliminary: Test 3

**Ring/Warm-up area Footing:** Grass/Grass level ground

**Other Dressage Info:** VSE 20 x 40; Training and Preliminary 40 x 80, Post and Chain Arena.

### Marathon

**Terrain:** Grass on Rolling hills, some pavement, country road crossing with crossing guards, no water. We will have a 6 passenger golf cart and horse drawn wagons for organizer to take people on a course walk. All obstacles are accessible from a pick-up or car using standard roadways and a short walk. Please do not bring your motorized vehicles – against National Park Service rules – bike rental on-site.

**Level:** Training; 3 Sections; 10 - 12 km; 5 Obstacles

**Level:** Preliminary; 3 Sections; 11- 13 km; 5 Obstacles

**Level:** VSE; 2 Sections; 5 Obstacles

**Ring/Warm-up area Footing:** Grass/Grass level ground

## Other Information

**Veterinary/Health Requirements:** Negative coggins within 1 year of show date for all competitors, please send copy with registration. Health certificate for out-of-state entries.

**Stabling Information:** Tented 9'x9' temporary stalls on-site at Howe Meadow; very limited high line, no electric paddocks please, all manure must be picked up and placed into receptacle provided – checkout inspection to earn refund of \$25 site/stall deposit.

**Driver/Groom twice around allowed on marathon? (Article 917)** Yes, as time permits only; driver or grooms may compete with a second entry at the discretion of the organizer, scheduling permitted. The second entry must be in a different division or entered as H.C and driven after the competing entry. Grooms may ride with more than one entry.

**Awards Offered:** 8 Ribbons per class; Championship ribbons and prizes.

**Food Available on the Grounds:** Box lunches both Sat & Sun \$8 each, dinner Sat evening all catered.

**Accommodations:** All brands at I-77 and Rt 18 about 10 miles away in Montrose, Ohio (Akron).

**Camping On Grounds:** Yes, limited primitive, Electric sites available for camping only at Howe Meadow.

**Off Grounds:** No

**Directions to Show:** From West either north or south – use I-77, exit 143 go east on SR 176, Wheatly Road 2.8 miles, keep straight onto Everett Rd 0.6 miles, turn RIGHT onto Riverview Rd for about 1.2 miles -- Large Rig entrance is identified before the main entrance to Howe Meadow – Rigs over 24 feet on the floor should use the Large Rig entrance. Registration under the tent near the barn. From East or South East – use Rt 8, exit SR 303 and go 3.7 west into Peninsula turn left onto Riverview Rd and go south 4.0 miles to 4140 Riverview or Howe Meadow, large rig entrance will be before the main entrance. Rigs over 24 feet on the floor should use the large rig entrance.
