OWNERS' PASSES

Three passes will be issued for the first horse / pony entered. Competitors with more than one horse will then be issued with an additional three passes per horse. Additional passes, at £16.50 each per day or £57.00 for the duration of the Show, may be paid for.

Competitors must request on the entry form should they require a car pass. Only one car pass per two horses may be issued.

Please send a large stamped addressed envelope, with a 96p stamp in order to receive your numbers and passes by post.

STABLING

Stabling will be available in a field adjacent to the Showground. THE STABLES CANNOT BE OCCUPIED BEFORE 2.00P.M. ON TUESDAY, 11TH MAY, AND MUST BE VACATED BY 10.00A.M. ON MONDAY, 17TH MAY. Stabling will not be provided for Owners' horses unless, at the time of entry, written application is made in the appropriate space provided on the entry form, and the fees paid. A charge of £53.50 per night is made for each loose box. Owners are asked to bring their own forage, as no fodder will be available. Please note that all boxes will be made up with easibed only. Extra bedding may be purchased if ordered and paid for in advance on the entry form. The stable fee of a horse entered but not sent to the Show will be forfeited. PLEASE NOTE THAT ONLY COMPETITORS STAYING FOR THE DURATION OF THE SHOW WILL BE ALLOWED TO PARK AND LEAVE THEIR HORSEBOXES NEAR THE STABLING AREA.

DAY BOXES

There is limited availability for stabling close to the Castle Arena and Copper Horse Arena. It is accessible from 6.30am but must be vacated by 8pm. All stables will be bedded down with easibed. The cost is £32 per day. Please note there is no vehicle access on to the Show site. ALL PERSONS MUST PARK THEIR HORSEBOXES IN THE HORSEBOX PARK AND WALK THEIR HORSES AND TACK ETC THROUGH TO THE DAY STABLING AREA.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION CERTIFICATES

Competitors in the International Driving Grand Prix please see page 23.

All horses and ponies entering the Showground must be vaccinated, and vaccination certificates / passports must accompany the horse or pony to the Show, and be available for checking.

After the initial equine influenza vaccination has been administered, a second must be applied within 21 to 92 days followed by third after 150 to 215 days. Thereafter, vaccinations must be administered annually with the last permissible day being the same date as the previous year's vaccination.

To avoid the disappointment of disqualification it is strongly advised that, if there is any doubt as to the validity of the vaccination certification, then your veterinary surgeon should be consulted at least two months before the Show. Please note that suckling foals are acceptable without vaccination certificates.

All horses / ponies taking part in competitions / displays other than those governed by the Rules of the FEI must have certificates of vaccination against Equine Influenza complying with the above.

PLEASE NOTE THAT NEITHER VACCINATION CERTIFICATES NOR PASSPORTS SHOULD BE SENT TO THE HORSE SHOW OFFICE PRIOR TO THE EVENT. HOWEVER, RANDOM CHECKS WILL BE CARRIED OUT ON THE SHOWGROUND FOR NATIONAL CLASSES, AND ALL PASSPORTS FOR INTERNATIONAL CLASSES MUST BE HANDED IN TO A REPRESENTATIVE IN THE PEDEN BLOODSTOCK CARAVAN PRIOR TO COMPETING, FROM WHERE THEY MAY ALSO BE COLLECTED.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR

Protective headgear must be worn by anybody riding a horse / pony for any reason. It is strongly recommended that hats to the standard PAS 015, EN1384 or ASTM F1163 with either a kitemark of SE1, correctly fastened, should be worn in all ridden classes. This includes all judges who may be required to ride and all grooms etc riding outside the show rings.

INTERNATIONAL DRIVING GRAND PRIX 2010 GENERAL RULES, REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS

1. **GENERAL:** The rules and regulations of the Royal Windsor Horse Show printed on pages 60 – 64 of this schedule also apply to the International Driving Grand Prix. In the event of conflict with the regulations 1 - 22 on pages 20 - 25 concerning the International Driving Grand Prix, the International Driving Grand Prix regulations will apply.

The Organisers referred to in these Rules and Conditions shall hereinafter mean Windsor Equestrian Promotions Ltd. The Royal Windsor Horse Show, International Driving Grand Prix 2008 will hereinafter be referred to as The Show.

2. **SPECIFICATION:** This event is organised in accordance with:
- FEI Statutes, 22nd edition, effective 15 April 2007, updated 21 November 2008
 - FEI General Regulations, 23rd edition, effective 1 January 2009
 - FEI Veterinary Regulations, 10th edition, effective 1 June 2009
 - FEI Anti-Doping Rules for Human Athletes, 2nd edition, effective 1 January 2009
 - Equine Anti-Doping And Medication Control Rules (EADMC), effective 1 June 2007, updated 10 April 2008.
 - **The Rules for Combined Driving Events, 10th edition, 1 January 2009**

And all subsequent corrections and modifications to the above Rules and Regulations as published by the FEI.

An arbitration procedure is provided for the FEI Statutes and General Regulations referred to above. In accordance with this procedure, any appeal against a decision rendered by the FEI or its official bodies is to be settled exclusively by the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) in Lausanne Switzerland.

3. **AMENDMENT TO THE SCHEDULE:** In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the Organising Committee reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.
4. **LIABILITY:** The Show, The Organisers, their respective Officers, Servants or Agents shall have no liability for any injury, loss or damage whatsoever and howsoever caused to or suffered by the Competitors, exhibitors, Invitees or Spectators, their property, servants, agents, horses or other animals. Each Competitor, Exhibitor and Invitee shall indemnify and save harmless the Organisers in respect of any damage or injury of whatever nature and howsoever occasioned to any person or property by any such Competitor or Exhibitor or any horse or other animal which he or she brings or is responsible for bringing to or upon the premises of the Organisers.

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

5. **INVITATIONS:**

- i) Invitations will be sent through National Federations to compete in classes as specified in the invitation. Only invited National Federations may make entries and in some classes it may be necessary for the OC to restrict the number of competitors. The OC will confirm after Nominated Entries.
- ii) Drivers of four in hands may enter up to ten and bring up to five horses / ponies and three grooms, drivers of pairs may enter six and bring up to three horses and two grooms, drivers of tandems may enter and bring three horses and two grooms and single drivers may enter two and bring one horse and one groom.

6. **CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES**

- (a) Entries in Principle: 12th March 2010
- (b) Nominated Entries: 12th April 2010
- (c) Definite Entries: 19th April 2010

All entries must be made on the Official Entry Form through National Federations.

Substitution of horses/ponies: After the definite entries have been made, substitutions of horses/ponies/competitors may only be made with the express permission of the OC. Horses/ponies may only be substituted if they are already on the Nominated Entry.

Please see paragraphs 9 (iii) (Overseas drivers) and 14 (British drivers) regarding applications for stabling.

Signature by the person making the entries, or in the case of competitors from overseas the person responsible at the respective National Federation shall be deemed to be an acceptance of the Conditions herein contained.

- 7. **WITHDRAWALS:** Withdrawals must be received not later than 12 noon 7th May 2010 after this period the OC retains the right to charge for all the stabling and entry fee.

 £300 per Horse Pair

- 9. MCP CHARGE: £6.50 (12.5 CHF) per horse. See Rule 12.

All cheques should be made payable to Royal Windsor Horse Show Club.

10. **FACILITIES OFFERED TO DRIVERS FROM OVERSEAS.**

- i) Stabling for horses of drivers from overseas will be provided free of charge. (Five per team, three per pair).
- ii) Electricity can be provided at £60 per connection. The Stable Manager will authorise these with payment on arrival. Electrical leads are to be provided by the Competitor with the full British 3 pin adaptor.
- iii) Horses of overseas drivers will each receive 2 bales of shavings per horse/pony will be provided on arrival, subsequent shavings can be bought.
- iv) Straw can be provided on request only at the competitors own expense
- v) Hay can be provided on request only and at the competitors own expense

- iv) Services of a Doctor, Farrier and Veterinary Surgeon are on site at the competitors own expense.
- v) National Federations, not the show, are responsible for any horses that do not immediately return home after the Show.
- vi) **CUSTOMS DOCUMENTS, HEALTH CERTIFICATES AND RE-EXPORT PAPERS**

Peden Bloodstock Ltd will charge each competitor for their export papers – payment is made direct to Peden's.

Details on compulsory health tests and, where applicable, quarantine period and protocol, etc. Please append specimen import licences which will be applied to horses attending this event. In case of doubt or problems, please contact the FEI Veterinary Department as soon as possible.

EC Competitors

We suggest that Peden Bloodstock be contacted at least 10 days prior to the competitors arrival with horses and ponies of EC origin, and at least three weeks prior to the arrival with horses and ponies from outside the EC. Each horse or pony must be accompanied by the current Intra-Community health certificate and its FEI Passport completed.

Non-EC Competitors

Each horse or pony arriving in England from a non-EC country must be accompanied by the correct health certificate for import into the EC and its FEI Passport fully completed; Peden Bloodstock will on request provide details of the health requirements and the appropriate certificate.

Horses, ponies, carriages and equipment from outside the EC must be accompanied by an ATA Carnet issued in the country of origin; these are obtainable from chambers of commerce and Peden Bloodstock will provide details on request. Either the National Federation or the competitor concerned will be held responsible for any costs in connection with temporary import into the EC for those animals or equipment not accompanied by an ATA Carnet.

British Export Welfare Regulations

Under British law Export Licences are required for every horse or pony leaving the country, any animal without one can be detained at the port of export and the driver could be prosecuted; the Licences are issued by the Ministry of Agriculture and Peden Bloodstock will obtain them for each animal, providing the essential information is supplied by each competitor at least ten days before the start of the Show.

Export Health Certificates

Peden Bloodstock can arrange for a health certificate for each horse or pony to return to its country of origin to be completed by the veterinary surgeon at the Show, provided that the essential information is supplied to them in time.

Please note that the Show Committee will not be responsible for any taxes or fines which may be due if any horse or equipment does not return to its country of origin at the end of the show. Should any claims be made against the Committee for any taxes or fines on horses or equipment which have remained in Great Britain or the EC the National Federation making the entry will be responsible for paying these.

DOGS AND CATS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE SHOWGROUND

11. VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, INSPECTIONS AND PASSPORT CONTROLS.

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 10th Edition, effective 1st June 2009 (see website www.fei.org)
These will be carried out in accordance with the “Veterinary Regulations”

“General Regulations”, 23rd Edition, effective 1st January 2009 will apply:

Art. 137.1

Every Horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix E) in a foreign country (see GRs 139.2), and all Horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional, Olympic Games and Paralympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 141.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, must be registered with the FEI, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 137.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix E) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all Horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

12. EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses intending to participate in FEI competition must have at least received an initial primary course of two vaccinations, given between 21 and 92 days apart. Thereafter, a third dose (referred to as the first booster) must be given within 6 months + 21 days after the date of administration of the second primary dose, with at least annual boosters given subsequently (i.e. within 365 days of the last dose).

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

Any competitor not complying with the above regulations will not be admitted to the stable compound.

13. SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; At CCI3* and CCI4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Cup Finals, Championships and Games, it is recommended that a minimum of 5% of all horses (with a minimum of 3 horses tested) are sampled (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

II. VETERINARY ASPECTS “B”

A) CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

Details of required customs documents, border crossing points, times of opening and customs agencies. NFs holding an international event in their country should inform their National Veterinary Authority

and their Customs Authority at least four weeks beforehand. They should request every facility to assist the movement of horses accompanied by FEI Passports, and the necessary veterinary certification at frontier crossing points into and out of their countries. (Vet. Regs.)

B) MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY

Details of FEI listed laboratory appointed to carry out analyses on samples collected at this event. (Vet. Regs.).

MCP CENTRAL LABORATORY - APPLICABLE ONLY TO GROUPS I & II

Under the Medication Control Programme (MCP) in **Groups I and II**, all samples collected in accordance with Vet. Regs. will be analysed by the **Laboratoire des Courses Hippiques (L.C.H), Verrières-le-Buisson, France**. The central MCP Laboratory will be reviewed in June 2009. Please refer to FEI Bulletin for further information. For events other than those listed in Vet. Regs. or for events other than in Groups I and II, samples may be analysed at an alternative FEI listed laboratory (Vet. Regs).

14. **VETERINARY SURGEONS:** Under no circumstances will any Veterinary Surgeon other than the Veterinary Commission be allowed to treat any horse or pony at the show, unless permission has been received from a member of the Veterinary Commission.

It is the responsibility of Owners of horses competing under FEI Rules to settle directly with the Show's veterinary surgeons any veterinary costs incurred while a horse / pony or horses / ponies in their ownership are on the Showground. If, for any veterinary or animal welfare reasons, a horse / pony is declared unfit to travel and has to remain in this country for treatment, any owner who fails to settle an account for veterinary and / or other related costs, may be reported to his National Federation and excluded from future entry to the Royal Windsor Horse Show.

Where, in the opinion of the Show's veterinary surgeon, a horse is so severely injured that it ought to be humanely destroyed, the owner / trainer / rider / driver should, wherever possible, first be informed. However, the Show's veterinary surgeon may proceed with humane destruction, without reference to owner / trainer / rider / driver, in order to prevent undue suffering to the horse. Before taking this action, the Show's Veterinary Surgeon should, wherever practicable, seek a second veterinary opinion. In such eventualities, owners are responsible for the cost of disposal.

15. **STABLING - BRITISH DRIVERS:** All British competitors will use their own portable stabling free of charge.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE AT SHOW: Drivers and horses may not arrive earlier than 1000 hrs on Tuesday 11th May must depart not later than 1000 hrs on Monday 17th May.

Horses and / or ponies will not be admitted to the Show between the hours of 2100 hrs and 0600 hrs unless by prior arrangement with the Organisers.

Departure: All competitors are required to stay for the prize giving on Sunday 17th May in the Castle Arena unless special permission is given by the OC.

16. **DOGS:** Dogs are not permitted on the showground.
17. **OBJECTIONS:** Objections must be made in writing in accordance with Article 168 - 171 of the FEI General Regulations and accompanied by a deposit of (150 CHF) in cash.
18. **Advertising and publicity on competitors and horses:** The competitors are authorized by the OC to display the logo of their personal sponsor on the carriage in accordance with Art 136. The competitors are authorized by the OC to display the logo of their personal sponsor on the marathon carriage (size 2520cm2) and on the back of the groom (1260 cm2).

19. **PASSES:** Admittance passes will be provided by the show as follows:-

20. **PRIZE MONEY:** Prize money for overseas competitors will be paid out two hours after the completion of the competition, from the Driving Secretaries Office.
- Following the United Kingdom Finance Act 1986 the prize money and prizes in kind won by overseas competitors will, net of allowable deductions, be liable to taxation at source.
21. **WELFARE OF THE HORSE – THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT**
 The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.
1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
 5. *The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.*

The Decision of the Committee or the Veterinary Surgeons or of any Judges or Show Officials upon any of the matters required by the following Rules to be decided or directed by any such persons or bodies including any question of height or soundness or want of merit or exclusion from final judging or granting any permission or otherwise shall be final and binding in all respects and no objections shall be made on account thereof nor shall any appeal lie therefrom on any ground whatever.

ENTRIES

2. The Committee will adhere as closely as possible to the published Schedule and Catalogue, but reserve the right in their absolute discretion to put forward or alter any class without notice, if they find it expedient to do so, and the right to refuse any entry, to accept any entry conditionally, and cancel any class through lack of entries or for any other reason, in their absolute discretion.

The Committee reserve the right without assigning any reason to alter the times of any Classes, or to judge Classes in Judging Rings other than those specified in the order of judging, or to make such alterations, including conditions of entry, as may be deemed necessary.

Owners must be bona fide owners on 2nd April, 2010, of the horses which they enter, and such Owner's name will appear in the Show Catalogue. The Owner alone will be recognised as being entitled to any money prizes which may be won by the entries made by him.

No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the entry fee. Entries must be made on the printed Entry Form obtainable from the Royal Windsor Horse Show, The Royal Mews, Windsor Castle, and must be fully completed and signed by the Owner. No horse will be entered until such entry forms are received and the fees paid. Unless the Entry Form is correctly completed the entries are null and void and the entry fees will be forfeited.

Any exhibitor whose cheque is not cleared through the banking system will incur a £25 surcharge, payable before entries can be accepted

ENTRIES CLOSE on 2nd April, 2010.

Discount is applicable for entries made online – www.rwhs.co.uk.

Entries are always subject to any unforeseen circumstances, such as military exigencies, strikes, or other civil disturbances, fire or other contingencies of any description preventing or rendering it undesirable in the opinion of the Committee for the Show to be held or continued as the case may be, and the Committee may postpone or abandon the Show at their discretion. All entries stand for any postponed show unless withdrawn by written notice to the Secretary within one week of notification of public announcement in the press of such postponement. The postponement or abandonment of the Show either before the opening or at any time during the course of the Show shall not give rise to any claim whatsoever against the Royal Windsor Horse Show or the Committee by Owners, Competitors or others except for refund of prepaid entry fees over £40.50 in respect of classes or competitions not held, or a proportionate part of such fees according to circumstances; in the case of postponement refund will only be made in respect of entries duly withdrawn.

Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry and stable fees to the Show and no refund will be made in any circumstances.

CLAIMS

3. The Owner of any horse which shall cause or occasion any damage or injury whatever shall indemnify and hold harmless the Show from and against all legal proceedings, actions, expenses, costs, claims, demands or damages whatsoever arising from any accident or other incident which may occur, and repair any injury which may be so occasioned. Each Owner shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any animal exhibited by him, and for the description as given in the Catalogue; and shall indemnify and hold harmless the Royal Windsor Horse Show in respect thereof as aforesaid.

Neither the Show nor any of its officers or servants shall be in any way responsible or accountable for anything that might happen from any cause or circumstances whatsoever to any persons, or Owners, or their servants, or to any animal or article exhibited, or property brought into the Show Ground and the adjoining Home Park, Windsor, or otherwise for anything else in connection with, or arising out of, or attributable to the Show, or these or any other conditions or regulations prescribed by the Show in relation thereto. Every Owner must have at least one servant in charge of the horse or horses or property exhibited by him.

The forgoing conditions shall expressly apply to all horses and those in charge of them at Stables let by or through the Show.

CARS AND VEHICLES. Vehicles are permitted on the showground, car and horse box parks ONLY AT OWNERS' RISK. No responsibility is accepted for cars or other vehicles and / or their contents left in the Official Car Park, or elsewhere, before, during, or after the Show, at any time. Maximum permitted speed is 10mph. All drivers to obey the instructions of security staff, car park attendants, stewards and other officials.

OBJECTIONS

4. Any objection or protest shall be lodged by obtaining a printed "Objection Form" from the Secretary's Office on the Show Ground, which must be properly filled up and signed by the Objector and delivered to the Secretary before or within thirty minutes of the end of the judging of the Class in respect of which the objection is lodged.

DEPOSIT (a) Objections (regarding height) to any animal holding an Official Measurement Certificate issued under the Joint Measurement Scheme will be referred to the Joint Measurement Scheme of the British Horse Society, British Show Horse Association, British Showjumping, National Pony Society and the British Show Pony Society, and Owners so objecting must deposit the sum of £100, which will be also forwarded with the objection.

(b) Any Owner lodging any objection for any other reason must deposit the sum of £100. If the objection is sustained the deposit of £100 will be refunded, otherwise the deposit will be forfeited.

5. A Sub-Committee of the Committee of the Show has been formed to consider and deal with all objections and it is a further express condition of entry that the decision of this Sub-Committee shall be absolutely final and binding on all competitors or others interested in any capacity on the Show Ground. The Committee shall consist of the Chairman, Colonel S H Cowen, Lieutenant Colonel J D Hetherington, C M Brooks Esq and J Youngs Esq. A sufficient quorum of the Committee shall be three.

CUPS AND CHALLENGE CUPS

6. (a) Prize-winners in every class eligible for Championship Classes and winners of prizes for Challenge Cups must compete for such Cups or they will forfeit their class prize money.
(b) Because of the unique and irreplaceable nature of many of the Royal Windsor Horse Show's cups and trophies, the Committee have reluctantly decided that winners of cups and trophies will not be permitted to take them from the showground.

CHILD'S CERTIFICATE OF AGE

7. In any class in which there is an age restriction the name, address and date of birth of the Child Rider must be stated on the Entry Form before an entry will be accepted, and the Parent or Guardian must, if required, produce to the Secretary a certified copy of the entry of birth within seven days of the date of such requirement.

HEIGHT

8. Recognised Official Measurement Certificates, issued under the Joint Measurement Scheme of the British Horse Society, British Show Horse Association, British Showjumping, National Pony Society and the British Show Pony Society only must be produced if required.

All horses must be properly shod except for in-hand classes.

A false declaration or misstatement of any kind (including a change of names of an animal or incorrect description, or false declaration of prizes won at Horse Shows) may at the discretion of the Committee

disqualify an Owner from the Show and the animal entered from any prize, and from entering or being entered again at the Royal Windsor Horse Show. In particular a misstatement as to height will automatically render the animal entered ineligible for any judging or prize. Owners must be prepared to verify any statement in a manner required by the Committee.

DISQUALIFICATION

9. In the case of an animal being disqualified whether as a result of any objection or otherwise, the winner of the next succeeding prize in that class shall take the prize that has been awarded to such disqualified animal, and the other animals shall take prizes accordingly, and the lowest monied prize in the class shall be taken by the reserve number.

ROSETTES

10. Rosettes will be awarded to first, second, third, fourth and fifth prize-winners in each class and where a sixth prize is offered a sixth rosette will also be awarded. In Championship classes rosettes will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champion.

CLASS

11. No alterations or substitutions of an entry will be allowed after it has been received. Entries must therefore be made in the appropriate class or classes for which the animals entered are eligible. In case of doubt as to the eligibility of any animal for any particular class or classes, entries may be made in more than one class on paying the fee for each class, and the animal will be judged in any class or classes for which it may be found to be eligible, but no refund of entry fees will be made.
A horse entered in a wrong class will be excluded from competition and the entry fee forfeited but at the discretion of the judges any horse over the specified weight may be directed to another class.
Owners may remove their animals from the Show Ground after judging of the classes in which they are entered, unless eligible for Championship Classes.
The number of animals which shall be asked to give an individual show in any class and the number of horses a Judge shall ride shall be left entirely to the discretion of the Judges.

ASSEMBLY

12. Competitors must assemble in the Pre-Collecting Ring at least half an hour before the appointed time at which they are to be judged or paraded as advertised in the Catalogue. Competitors arriving in the Pre-Collecting Ring after their Class has entered the Arena / Ring will be disqualified.

CHILDREN'S RIDING CLASSES

13. The wearing and use of spurs is forbidden.

NUMBERS

14. An animal entered in more than one class will have only one numbered card, which must be used each time the horse is shown. Competitors wearing an incorrect number or more than one number in the Ring are liable to disqualification.
Number cards to be worn on the rider's or attendant's back. In Driving Classes the number must be affixed on the back of the vehicle when the Horse enters the ring.

OWNERS' PASSES

15. Three passes will be issued for the first horse / pony entered. Competitors with more than one horse will then be issued with an additional three passes per horse / pony.
Please note there are Horse Box Passes. Car Passes will be issued if requested on the Entry Form - one per two horses.

PLEASE SEND A LARGE STAMPED ADDRESSED ENVELOPE, WITH A 96p STAMP, IN ORDER TO RECEIVE YOUR NUMBERS, BADGES ETC BY POST.

DRESS

16. In the Hackney Classes: Gentlemen drivers must appear in appropriate dress or uniform. No stable dress is allowed.

In the Hunter and Jumping Classes: Gentlemen riders must be in uniform, or hunting costume. Ladies side-saddle: In riding habit with hat. Ladies astride: In jacket, hat, breeches and boots.

In the Hack and Cob Classes: Gentlemen riders must be in uniform or appropriate hacking costume - silk hat or bowler hat, breeches and boots or riding trousers. Ladies side-saddle: In riding habit with hat. Ladies astride: In jacket, hat, breeches and boots.

In the Children's Riding Classes: boys and girls must appear in appropriate riding dress with hats.

In "In Hand" classes, or classes where grooms or attendants are permitted to enter the ring during Preliminary or Final judging they must be correctly dressed. Headwear, coats, collars and ties must be worn. These regulations apply to Day and Evening Sessions.

Protective headgear must be worn by anybody riding a horse / pony for any reason. It is strongly recommended that current hats to the standard PAS015, EN1384 or ASTM F1163 with either a kitemark or SE1, correctly fastened, should be worn in all ridden classes. This includes all judges who may be required to ride and all grooms etc riding outside the show rings.

POWER TO APPOINT OTHER JUDGES

17. The Judges named in the Schedule have accepted an invitation to officiate. The Committee reserves the right to appoint a substitute Judge.

POWER TO WITHHOLD OR DIVIDE PRIZES

18. The Judges have the power to withhold any prize, either from want of merit in the horse exhibited or from insufficiency of competition in the classes, or to divide a prize, or to judge two sections of a competition as one class.

VETERINARY EXAMINATION

19. The Judges of every class shall have power to require any animal to be examined for soundness by the Veterinary Surgeons. The result of any veterinary examinations shall be regarded as confidential. Unsoundness, notwithstanding an award of prizes, will disqualify, except in the Jumping Competition.

It is the responsibility of Owners of horses / ponies based in the United Kingdom to settle directly with the Show's veterinary surgeons any veterinary costs incurred while a horse / pony or horses / ponies in their ownership are on the Showground if, for any veterinary or animal welfare reasons, a horse is declared unfit to travel. Any owner who fails to settle a veterinary account and / or other related costs will be excluded from future entry to the Royal Windsor Horse Show.

Where, in the opinion of the Show's veterinary surgeon, a horse is so severely injured that it ought to be humanely destroyed, the owner / trainer / rider / driver should, wherever possible, first be informed. However, the Show's veterinary surgeon may proceed with humane destruction, without reference to owner / trainer / rider / driver, in order to prevent undue suffering to the horse. Before taking this action the Show's Veterinary Surgeon should, wherever practicable, seek a second veterinary opinion. In such eventuality, owners are responsible for the cost of disposal.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION CERTIFICATES

20. See page 11.

POWER TO REJECT OR REMOVE

21. The Committee reserve the power to reject or remove any horse, Owner or servant from the Show, or to refuse admission, without being required to assign any reason or being liable for compensation.

NO ADMISSION TO SHOW RING

22. Only Officials appointed by the Committee (other than Competitors) shall at any time be allowed to enter the Show Ring.
Exercising in any of the Rings is strictly prohibited and anyone found exercising in any Ring will be disqualified from competing at the Show and any prize money already won will be forfeited.

AMATEUR AWARDS

23. Professional whips, or those dealing in, or anyone buying or selling horses on commission, are not eligible for these awards. Exhibitors who are eligible must state the name of the driver on the entry form.

QUESTIONS NOT PROVIDED FOR

24. Should any question arise not provided for in these Conditions it must be referred to the Committee, whose decision shall be final.

PRIZE MONEY

25. Cheques for the prizes awarded will be forwarded by post to the Owners within six weeks of the Show. An Owner will be deemed to have waived his prize money in favour of the Show if he has not presented his cheque by 31st August 2010, after which date payment of the cheques will be stopped.
Should there only be eight entries or less forward in a class, prize money will only be awarded down to third place.
Would overseas competitors please note than any payments (including prize money and prizes in kind) made in excess of £1,000 are subject to taxation at source.

JUMPING CLASSES

26. During the Jumping Competition three competitors must always be ready to enter the ring. If a Competitor does not respond when his number is called by the Steward he loses his turn and the horse bearing the number may be eliminated.
Unless Competitors declare by the correct time they will not be allowed to jump.

INSURANCES

27. All owners and competitors are responsible for damages to third parties howsoever caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. It is a condition of entry that all owners and competitors have third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events, and to keep the policy up to date.

ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES AND MOTORCYCLES

28. Please note that ATV's (all terrain vehicles) and motorcycles will not be allowed on the showground due to Health & Safety Regulations.

HAWKERS

29. No hawkers are allowed onto the showground including the car and horse box parks. No goods, newspapers etc may be sold or advertised anywhere on the showground except within the authorised trade stands.

PHOTOGRAPHY

30. No professional photography is allowed on the showground except with permission obtained from the Press Office.
